INTRODUCTION

Financing the rising costs of a college education may seem like a daunting task, but don't worry, there are many funds available. It's just a matter of finding them. This *booklet* prepared by the New Mexico State University Indian Resources Development Program lists sources of financial aid for Native American college students and potential college students. It does not list every source, but it can be a beginning point in your search for funds with which to finance your education. Eligibility requirements and deadlines vary for every scholarship listed. We strongly urge you to contact potential sources for further information and requirements, as this is only an informative guide.

COLLEGE-BASED FUNDING

Most colleges offer financial aid to their students. Ask the college you will be attending to send you any available financial aid information. Some colleges publish a guide to scholarships and specific types of financial aid sources and local scholarships.

STATE OF NEW MEXICO PROGRAM

The State of New Mexico offers several state incentive grants and loans. You can see the details on starting on page 19 of this booklet.

FEDERAL AID PROGRAMS

The five federal aid programs include Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grants, Federal Work-Study, Federal Perkins Loans, and Federal Stafford Loans. Eligibility requirements for each of these programs can be provided by your preferred school. Contact your financial aid office to ask about these federal aid programs and to ask if you qualify.

AMERICAN INDIAN FINANCIAL AID SOURCES

There are many sources of financial aid for Native American students. Financial aid offered specifically to Native American students can be offered by specific tribes or organizations that support Native American students. Eligibility requirements can be tribal specific or require that tribal affiliation be proven. Be sure to read the requirements carefully. Some of these sources could also be offered to minority students which Native American students may apply for, as they are considered minorities.

For every year of service, a portion of the loan will be forgiven. If the entire service agreement is fulfilled, 100% of the loan is eligible for forgiveness. Penalties may be assessed if the service agreement is not satisfied. The award may be renewable for up to four years if application is submitted each year.

As a condition of each loan, the student shall declare his/her intent to return to New Mexico to practice as a professional in their field of study.

For every year of service provided, a portion of the loan will be forgiven. If the entire service agreement is fulfilled, 100% of the loan is eligible for forgiveness. Penalties will be assessed if the service agreement is not satisfied.
